Themes

Some ideas for themes could include but not limited to the following:

- There is an ocean of wisdom within each faith
- What has life taught you about:

 - The Power of love, peace, truth, respect, compassion, inclusiveness, justice, contentment
- Scenes of sacred spaces, festivals, customs and rituals
- What makes you think of the creator and creation?
- Just about anything that inspires you to treat each other and our planet with love, understanding and respect.

Rules

1. The maximum size of the artwork shall be **46 cm x 61 cm (18" x 24")**.
2. Artwork may be in any medium but must be either suitable for framing or have its own frame suitable for hanging.
3. Keep the durability of the media used in mind as the selected art will form a traveling exhibit.
4. Submit artwork flat to avoid cracks in the paper or paint
5. Each school may submit a maximum of 5 pieces of art (only 1 piece/artist).
6. The decision of the judges shall be final.
7. The artwork must be submitted in time.
8. All costs for submitting art are at the expense of the school and return cost of Multi-Faith Saskatchewan. Make sure your art teacher has signed your entry form.
9. Fill out the entry form completely. Use paste or strong tape to secure the entry to the back of the artwork submitted.
10. A short text message of the submitted art can be included in the art.
