SASKATCHEWAN VISUAL ART PROJECT

Celebration of Art, Faith and Spirituality

Saskatchewan is very diverse with its many different cultures and faiths. To help celebrate this, we have initiated a Saskatchewan Visual Arts project targeted at Grade 10-12 art classes. This project entails submission of art that reflects our specific guidelines and criteria.



We will be recognizing up to fifteen pieces of student art, which will be a part of our touring exhibit that will promote mutual understanding and respect for spirituality and faiths.

Half Day Workshop

The Organization of Saskatchewan Arts Councils will offer a half-day workshop on photographing and creating artwork for participants of the Saskatchewan Visual Art Project. Professionally presenting artwork is an important skill for emerging artists to develop and is a vital component in applying to future shows or educational opportunities. This workshop will help to cultivate these skills for young artists and familiarize them with industry standards.

Opening Reception - Award Presentation

We shall be recognizing up to fifteen pieces of student art with medals, certificates of recognition, and prizes, with the top ten entries receiving cash awards. Parents and teachers of the winning students shall be invited to the opening reception. All artwork will be returned, at our expense, to each sponsoring school by June 1, along with certificates of participation, except for the pieces chosen for touring. Those pieces will be returned by June of the following year.

The theme of the project is to encourage and assist students to create art that will celebrate all those things that make life better for you, for all of humankind and for the planet. Respectful expression from any faith or culture will be accepted. The artwork needs to be suitable for the classroom work and reflect the current Saskatchewan Art Education Curriculum.



Themes

Some ideas for themes could include but not limited to the following:

- We are one human family
- We are more alike than different: but differences make life interesting
- Sustainability of life, Care of the Mother Earth, Greening and Recycling
- We are part of nature, relying on our natural environment for life
- There is an ocean of wisdom within each faith
- What has life taught you about:
 - Hate, racism, prejudice, violence, superiority, segregation, bullying
 - The Power of love, peace, truth, respect, compassion, inclusiveness, justice, contentment
- Scenes of sacred spaces, festivals, customs and rituals
- What makes you think of the creator and creation?
- Just about anything that inspires you to treat each other and our planet with love, understanding and respect.



Rules

1. The maximum size of the artwork shall be **46 cm x 61 cm (18" x 24")**.
2. Artwork may be in any medium but must be either suitable for framing or have its own frame suitable for hanging.
3. Keep the durability of the media used in mind as the selected art will form a traveling exhibit.
4. Submit artwork flat to avoid cracks in the paper or paint
5. Each school may submit a maximum of 5 pieces of art (only 1 piece/artist).
6. The decision of the judges shall be final.
7. The artwork must be submitted in time at the location listed below.
8. All transportation costs for the submitted art are at the expense of the school and return cost of Multi-Faith Saskatchewan. Make sure your art teacher has signed.
9. Fill out the entry form completely. Use paste or strong tape to secure the entry to the back of the artwork submitted.
