Rules

1. The maximum size of the artwork shall be **46 cm x 61 cm (18" x 24")**.
2. Artwork may be in any medium.
3. Computer generated digital art shall be accepted.
4. AP art students shall be allowed to submit digital image of their art.
5. Submit artwork flat to avoid cracks in the paper or paint.
6. Each school may submit a maximum of 5 pieces of art (only 1 piece/artist).
7. The decision of the judges shall be final.
8. The artwork must be submitted before the deadline date.
9. All costs for submitting art are at the expense of the school and return at the cost of the project organizing committee.
10. Make sure your art teacher has signed your entry form.
11. Fill out the entry form completely. Use paste or strong tape to secure the entry to the back of the artwork submitted. If the art is submitted electronically, send the copy of the entry form signed by the art teacher.
